2019-2020 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES and APPLICATION PROCEDURES

All applications including need and merit must be received by the deadline of May 31, 2019. *Each application will be numbered in the order it is received at the SEF office at 1260 Timberlane Road.* The scholarship chairperson will confirm that all required documents are attached to the application. Any application that does not have all the documents will be disqualified. *The first 10 complete applications that are submitted will be reviewed.* These applications will be forwarded to the Application Review Committee. The Application Review Committee will rank the applications. The number of scholarships that will be awarded is based upon the monies available. All applicants will receive notification by the 30th of June. Thank you for applying for an SEF scholarship.

Your application must include:

- ◆ A handwritten essay by the applicant
- ◆ A letter of recommendation from an adult mentor
- ◆ A completed application
- ◆ If completing a financial need-based application, a copy of the filed 2018 1040 Tax Return (joint or individual) is required

Only one scholarship per family will be awarded.

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This music education program was established to provide music scholarships for **K-12th grade students**. It is funded primarily through endowments provided by individuals and businesses in our community who recognize the need to further enhance children's educational needs.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS: Applicants must be between the age of 5 and 17 for K - 12th grade scholarships.

DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS: **May 31, 2019**

NOTIFICATION OF AWARD: After the SEF Board approves the scholarship recipients, award letters and acceptance forms will be mailed by **June 30, 2019**. Failure to return the acceptance form by **July 15, 2019** may result in forfeiture of the scholarship.

PAYMENT OF AWARD: The Board will disburse funds each academic term to the Foundation's approved providers, after verification of enrollment. Merit recipients will be awarded scholarships for 50% of the provider's tuition. Guidelines are provided to each merit recipient, which allows the recipient the opportunity to increase the percentage received.

Please read and follow the instructions carefully and adhere to the deadline set by the Board of Directors of STUBBS' EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION (SEF). Application materials received after the deadline will not be considered.

1. Submit the following materials:
 - A. A handwritten essay by the applicant.
 - B. Letter of recommendation. If you are currently enrolled in a music program, the letter should be written by your teacher who can discuss your potential for future success. If you are not currently enrolled, you may have an individual who has worked closely with you (e.g., a school teacher, pastor, coach, employer, etc.) comment on your personal achievement and your potential for success in music.
 - C. Completed application form
 - D. Copy of the completed 2018 - 1040 Tax Return (Joint or Individual) if applying for financial need-based scholarship.
2. Contingent upon funding, scholarships, except the Mitchell Scholarship, are renewable for up to **six years**, provided the recipient is making satisfactory progress and meets minimum performance requirements. Students previously awarded scholarships will be given preference.
3. Scholarship recipients must have, and maintain, a minimum level of evaluative performance each term. The instructor will recommend at the end of each term if the scholarship should be renewed for the next term.
4. Applicants for financial need-based scholarships must provide appropriate tax materials for **each** academic year in which they desire the scholarship. See financial formula on next page. A minimum of 70% of scholarships go to financial need-based students.
5. **ALL** scholarship recipients must notify the Foundation of their intent to accept by **July 15, 2019**.
6. Alternative award recipients of a scholarship must meet all minimum eligibility requirements at the time of the award in order to receive a forfeited scholarship.
7. The Board of Directors has specified that the Scholarship Application Review Committee will review the applications without knowing the name of the applicant or his/her sponsor. This will provide as fair a review process as possible.
